3. California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) - Review
 - Taken in fall by 7th graders in 2022/2023 & 2023/2024
 - Looking at the relationship between the OUSD Mission Statement “A Learning Community That Inspires, Engages and Supports” & CHKS results. The mission statement is then supported by these four themes.
 - General CHKS findings
 - 272 Students took survey
 - Over 100 questions
 - 73% Feel connected to school
 - 68% Feel motivated academically
 - 37% Find school boring
 - 8% Feel school is a waste of time
 - 69% Have a caring adult relationship
 - 1% Have tried drugs and alcohol
 - 85% Eat breakfast daily
 - 35% Have meaningful participation at school
 - Site Council got into breakout groups looking at results and categorizing them by module into: success, challenges and action ideas. Three modules used were: Core Module, Behavior and Mental Health Module, Social Emotional Health.

 - Feel safe & accepted
 - Home support

 - Ways to stay calm
 - Body image
 - Eating disorder
